Challenges

The constraints and difficulties confronting the management of water resources (at all levels) with respect to capacity building, monitoring, socio-economic activities, policy etc

• IWRM takes place at various levels and at each level there must be knowledge acquisition

• The problem of vandalism of water monitoring equipment possess a threat to use of real time technologies for monitoring

• Use of innovative technologies should go hand in hand with community education or knowledge transfer.

• Comprehensive and quality data in various aspects of IWRM is needed to convince decision makers of the consequences of inaction.

•Africa has low adaptive capacity to climate change and research is key in dealing with this issue considering the currently low funding allocated for funding research

• Basin organizations and affiliates need to link up with research institutions and universities in addressing indentified objectives
