EMWIS Algeria: the winning team

The Euro-Mediterranean Water Information System, or EMWIS, is an online network with the objective of facilitating information exchange in the water sector. Thirty-seven European and Mediterranean countries are participating in this network which currently has fourteen national web sites up and running. The Constantinois-Seybouse-Mellegue Catchment Basin Agency represents Algeria within EMWIS.

Constantine – The National Focal Point (NFP) of EMWIS in Algeria is located in Constantine, a town 400 kilometres east of Algiers. The development, management and administration of the EMWIS.dz Internet site is carried out by the Constantinois-Seybouse-Mellegue Catchment Area Agency, headed by Mr. Khatim Kherraz. "Our agency was designated as the Focal Point by the Algerian Water Resources Minister during the Euro-Mediterranean Ministerial Conference at Turin in October 1999. The web site was developed during the month of February 2000 and was operational six months later. The official launch was at a regional information seminar held in Algiers in July 2001", explains Mr. Kherraz.

About the network

What is EMWIS ?

According to the official definition, this network "aims to facilitate access to information about know-how in the water sector, by giving priority to the following five themes: institutions working in the water sector and their representatives, documentation, training opportunities, research and development programmes and data management. EMWIS also aims to develop the exchange of useful information, preparing joint products and promoting the necessary cooperation programmes". In the case of Algeria, the involvement of the Catchment Area Agency in the EMWIS programme turned out to be a real human adventure. "We must admit that, basically, our organisation is not really specialised in managing an information system. So we trained a team to administer the site. I must say that the success of our partici-

Trilingualism

The person in charge of documentation, Miss Yasmine Benmostefa, is the linchpin of the team. "I was recruited for my translation skills. But very soon, I took over the management and updating of the content. Initially, searching for information was often tiresome, in the absence of established procedures", says Miss Benmostefa. As time has gone by, the documentalist of EMWIS.dz has developed her own search, sorting and updating procedures for the information. "Four or five items are

Even better, thanks to her abilities, the Algerian Focal Point handles the translation of the newsletters issued monthly by the technical unit of the EMWIS programme based in the south of France.

New configuration

In a networked system, the IT expert's role is of the utmost importance. Programming and development of the Algerian portal is done by Mr. Rafik Assas. "We have come a long way", Mr. Assas recalls. "In the beginning, we developed a ded-

put up on the site every day. The Algerian press, particularly the Agence Press Service (APS), is one of our main information sources. We are also in contact with all the institutes and university research centres, which enables us to give very valuable information about training. The training section of the site has one of the highest numbers of hits". But the documentalist's work is not just limited to content management.

Yasmine Benmostefa is also responsible – in fact, first and foremost – for the translation work. Thanks to her work, the EMWIS Algeria site is available in three languages: French, Arabic and English.

Now, we are implementing a new configuration, the third since the programme started. This platform will be identical to that of the official EMWIS site".

support and assistance of an engineer, Mr. Bouchedja Abdellah. He says: "I am in charge of the studies, projects and research department. My role consists basically of validating that the information meets quality standards. In a network like ours, it is im-

tant that the information and data that we put online should be reliable. This is teamwork, and requires intensive research".
